On September 14, around 11.30pm a very sad thing took place in the darkness of a house on the way to Mae Salong district. The family of Kuen Chaisri shed tears until the morning of the new day.

Kuen Chaisri, 15 years old, can't see the beauty of the world anymore. Two years ago she became blind due to a chronic disease, but that night she left this life, because she reached the limit of her patience to suffer in her sick body.

This experience maybe shows, that we have waited too long with our help. Enough money was gathered to help her in the way we had planned, but unfortunately our response was too late. Sometimes one can't wait. We would have liked to help immediately and wish money wouldn't have been a matter.
